



Super Priority Group (SPG) Qualification Criteria

At least one of the benefits set out below must apply in order for a household to qualify as being part of the Super Priority Group. These are not the same as the Priority Group qualifying benefits that were available previously.

The installer must check proof of one of these benefits and send the customer benefit number for verification before the voucher can be issued.

At least one of the following benefits must apply:

- a) **State Pension Credit** (please note this is not the same as a State Pension)
No further qualifying components are required to meet SPG
- b) **Child Tax Credit** and has relevant income below £16,190 (where “relevant income” has the same meaning as Part I of the Tax Credits Act 2002);
No further qualifying components are required to meet SPG
- c) **Income-related employment employment and support allowance**, which must include a work-related activity or support component, **and** –
 - i) Has parental responsibility for a child under the age of five who ordinarily resides with that member; **or**
 - ii) Is in receipt of a **qualifying component** (see below)
- d) **Income-based job seeker’s allowance** and –
 - i) Has parental responsibility for a child under the age of five who ordinarily resides with that member; **or**
 - ii) Is in receipt of a **qualifying component** (see below)
- e) **Income support** and –
 - i) Has parental responsibility for a child under the age of five who ordinarily resides with that member; **or**
 - ii) Is in receipt of a **qualifying component** (see below)

Qualifying Components

- a) Child tax credit which includes a disability or severe disability element
- b) A disabled child premium
- c) A disability premium, enhanced disability premium or severe disability premium
- d) A pensioner premium, high pensioner premium or enhanced pensioner premium
